Her mother stopped me before I left her bedside and was in tears, You have given my daughter your sterling silver necklace????!!!

Her husband intervened with a cheerful, of course she has! That's our Lou Ann!! Those words were the highest compliment I could have received and they made me feel ten thousand stories tall. My friend was smiling as though she had won the grandest of trophies even though she was only days before dying of brain cancer.

Recently, I found myself telling the ladies on one of our day trips of the story of Anita and how I had just found a replacement necklace of the one I had given away about a year ago that I thought I would never find the replacement of it ever again. It was one of my all-time favorite necklaces of a galloping horse and it had blingy rhinestones on it. I had already given away several of these same necklaces but this was the last one I had and I feared there were no replacements so I avoided giving away this particular one several times already when I was faced with a lady who stopped me several times on a cruise ship to comment on this necklace. I got out of my comfort zone and got up to sing on the ship one evening and as I was going back to my seat, out of the sea of faces in the darkened room, she grabbed my hand and again commented on the necklace and complimented me on singing. I was still shakey from nervousness from singing as I decided that God wanted this woman to have my necklace so even though I might never see another one of these again, I was going to give it to her. Now mind you, I was giving her something pretty big in my mind because this was one of my *all-time favorites* but the urge to just give it to her was pretty strong so I just went with it and blessed it as I handed it to her. # The City of Pasadena Offers Options for Older Adults and People with Disabilities

The City of Pasadena Transportation **RIDES** Program



# TRANSPORTATION

## What is RIDES?

**RIDES** program provides non-emergency transportation services to qualified extremely low to moderate income\* seniors and/or people with disabilities of any age who reside in Pasadena and who are not able to drive themselves, do not own a vehicle, or medically/physically unable to drive. **RIDES** helps them find the transportation they need for travel to essential medical services, grocery shopping, errands, social activities as well as for other needs. If eligible, a participant may receive monthly **RIDES** program funds (up to \$75 per month) that may be used with any of the designated transportation providers.

**RIDES** is funded in part by the City of Pasadena Community Development Block Grant and is limited to the available funds.

## How do you apply?

To become a new user of **RIDES**, you must first apply and have your eligibility verified.

Applicants must submit the following with their application:

- Proof of household income
- Copy of current Social Security Award Letter
- Copy of last month's Bank Statement
- Copy of valid DL or ID card with picture
- Completed physician's disability statement (if the applicant has a disability and is under the age of 65)

\* Eligible Income by Family Size  
Effective March 6, 2015


