Lou Ann Words of Wisdom

Now that Harvey has past and we are in recovery mode..I will get back to my usual story telling.

Sometimes when we go through traumatic times, we look back at other such times in our lives and remember a particular event that defines that time for us. Our own Pasadena EOC (Emergency Operations Center) manager, Mr. Frank Bengochea, spoke at our Silver Star Senior meeting on October 3 and reminded me of such an event that took place during Ike that he will always remember.

We were both part of the EOC during the marathon of Hurricane Ike. We thought the winds and the rain would never stop. The National Guard was staying on the grounds out at the Pasadena Convention Center during the storm to help with the immediate emergency clean-up of our city and the surrounding cities. Such clean-up often included tasks that are too gruesome to even mention but they diligently worked in the heat without much rest to get things cleaned up. They all had their own duffle bags of personal clothing but after about 10 days of sweltering heat and nasty clean-up, those clothes were badly in need of laundering. The only problem was that there were no laundromats open or other places and not very many homes that even had electricity at this point. Well those EOC guys thought I could solve just about any problem, I guess, because they would throw things my way and I'd always try to solve them, even got them parts for huge generators and the generators themselves at times using connections and friendships because I learned that even gold could not buy you a generator at that point in time. It's strange how money loses its value and yet human bonds are the only things that do matter.

Soooo, I get this phone call from EOC dispatch asking if I could arrange to figure out how to launder 39 huge duffle bags full of dirty clothes overnight. (Now mind you, those military issue duffle bags are about four feet tall and two feet in diameter.) I gave the Dispatcher/Commander at the EOC, Charlie Sanders, my standard answer...that I would see what I could do and that I would get back to him in two hours. You see, that was one of my standard answers is to tell people that I would get back to them in two hours. Almost always they were thrilled when I usually got back in less than two hours. But two hours gave them a time limitation that soothed their frazzled nerves and gave them some bearing in the craziness of the unknown.

Well, I started calling the women and men that I knew had electricity in their homes, Paul Leteff was one, his next door neighbors, Councilman Phil Cayten and his wife, Roxy Cayten, were another. The people I enlisted often called their neighbors to take some on and so on it went. I went down my calling list of friends, each taking what they could until all bags were claimed. Not one person that I called declined. NOT ONE!!!! Some even took multiple bags. (I think I washed two duffle bags that night myself and got very little sleep and my former neighbor and her husband even took one.) Needless to say, within the scope of those two hours, I called the EOC back to tell them "Mission Accomplished! Washers are ready, willing, able, and on stand-by, ready to spring into action at your 'ready call'. Just tell me where and when I can pick up the duffle bags and I will deliver them to my friends who are truly angels on earth."

Lou Ann Words of Wisdom Contined

I could hear cheers of disbelief and high five slaps on the other end of the phone from one of the National Guard Commanders who, as I recall, was named Billy.

I went within hours to collect the dirty laundry bags and, believe it or not, managed to get all 39 stinking bags of dirty clothes stuffed into one borrowed Chevy Suburban. I can scarcely describe the smell in that vehicle as I delivered the bags to their destinations that evening. I was afraid that truck might never be the same and that smell might never come out! LOL! It was fairly odiferous to say the least but it was literally the smell of the blood, sweat and tears of a dedicated group of men and women who were first responders and those that they helped, so, I figured, I could at least endure the stench for a bit. That stench reminded me to be grateful that my life was spared and grateful that I was not a victim that needed their help and grateful that they were here to help our community. I might add that they never, ever complained either. I felt honored and grateful for the opportunity to help them and very proud of the kind and precious friends who offered their help, their electricity and their laundry detergent.

The next things that happened were the most rewarding. The next day, as I gathered the duffle bags back up, they smelled fresh and clean. The women and men that did the washing told me stories of how they engaged the help of neighbors helping them wash and dry and in some cases repair the clothing. Some even delivered the duffle bags back to me rather than me having to drive to pick them back up. It was wonderful! Each person separately told me that they had included notes to the men and women thanking them for their service. I was completely flabbergasted that they had all done the same thing without knowing the other angels that helped that evening were doing the same as they were doing. It was all spontaneous. The other rewarding experience was witnessing the receipt of the clean clothing as some of the National Guard's men and women had tears of gratitude in their eyes, some jumped up and down and hooted and hollered, and some were so moved by the notes that the laundry angels left that they tracked me down the next day to thank me personally and get contact information so they could personally thank them. I even much later received a personal note from one of the mothers of a National Guardsmen, thanking me for seeing that their loved one had clean clothes to wear in the muck of things. It was so incredible.

The EOC and the National Guard referred to me afterwards as the head of the Angel Laundry Service. Days later as the National Guard left the grounds of the Convention Center in a convoy, they were all honking the vehicle horns, waving and shouting out words of gratitude and love to me as they left. Some even stopped for a second to hand me a note or a book or a hug or a trinket that meant something special to them to share with me. All this is just to illustrate how important it is to work together for a purpose. Even Councilman Cayten joked in council meeting about how he came home to find his washing machine full of other men's clothes and how he blamed it on me then he went on to praise us all and his wife for her great charitable heart.

To show gratitude to others is such a critical and rewarding thing to experience. My friends were grateful for the help our community received and they were grateful for the opportunity to help those who were helping the region recover. To them it was a little thing but to those National Guardsmen and Guardswomen it was something money could not buy. The National Guardsmen were grateful for the help and for being recognized for their service. The EOC was grateful to be able to solve a very real problem and was grateful that our helpers were comforted. I was grateful that I was given the challenge and opportunity to assist in this whole ordeal. I was quite humbled that they all trusted me with their only clothes other than the ones literally on their backs. And, I was told later, that all clothes were accounted for and not even a sock was missing to the astonishment of the troops.

I was truly amazed that in one day we washed 39 duffle bags full of laundry in separate homes.

I am grateful for my precious friends and for their precious friends who made it all possible.

I am grateful and I am thankful!!! As it is Thanksgiving time this month, remember to be grateful and thankful for the little things in life! Clean socks are always a blessing, wherever in the world you are and whatever in the world you are doing!!! Thank you, Frank, for remembering our times in the EOC during Hurricane Ike and for sharing that it was a memory you will never forget!!!

The City of Pasadena Offers Options for Older Adults and People with Disabilities

The City of Pasadena Transportation **RIDES** Program



TRANSPORTATION

What is RIDES?

RIDES program provides non-emergency transportation services to qualified extremely low to moderate income* seniors and/or people with disabilities of any age who reside in Pasadena and who are not able to drive themselves, do not own a vehicle, or medically/physically unable to drive. **RIDES** helps them find the transportation they need for travel to essential medical services, grocery shopping, errands, social activities as well as for other needs. If eligible, a participant may receive monthly **RIDES** program funds (up to \$75 per month) that may be used with any of the designated transportation providers.

RIDES is funded in part by the City of Pasadena Community Development Block Grant and is limited to the available funds.

How do you apply?

To become a new user of **RIDES**, you must first apply and have your eligibility verified.

Applicants must submit the following with their application:

- Proof of household income
- Copy of current Social Security Award Letter
- Copy of last month's Bank Statement
- Copy of valid DL or ID card with picture
- Completed physician's disability statement (if the applicant has a disability and is under the age of 65)
