But it just goes to show you that what we think might not be of value or might not be worth much, is worth more than gold to others and especially to children. I had no idea and felt kind of guilty a tad for judging that the Mc Donald's toys were not worth much because to this particular kid, they were worth more than anything else anyone could have given her. I never forgot that lesson so I just learned to be grateful for everything and learned that everything matters. And, I prayed to God a thanks, for letting me pick that silly old shoe box filled with old McDonald's give-away toys for that child, for certainly God was using me that day for a mission.

# TRANSPORTATION

## What is Transportation **RIDES**? How to apply?

**Transportation RIDES** program provides non-emergency transportation services to qualified extremely low to moderate income\* seniors(65+ years) and/or people with disabilities (18-64 years) who reside in Pasadena and who are not able to drive themselves, do not own a vehicle, or medically/physically unable to drive. **Transportation RIDES** helps them find the transportation they need for travel to essential medical services, grocery shopping, errands, social activities as well as for other needs. If eligible, a participant may receive monthly **RIDES** program funds (\$75 per month) that may be used with any of the designated transportation providers.

**Transportation RIDES** is funded in part by the City of Pasadena Community Development Block Grant Program through the Madison Jobe Senior Center/Parks & Rec. and is limited to Community Development Department's available funds.

To become a new user of **Transportation RIDES**, you must first apply and have your eligibility verified.

Applicants must submit the following with their application:

- Proof of Gross Annual Household Income
- Copy of current Social Security Award Letter
- Proof of Current Social Security Amount
- Copy of valid DL or ID card with picture
- Completed Disability Statement (if the applicant has a disability and is between the ages of 18 to 64)
