### **Lou Ann Stories**

I am always in a quandary as to what to write about and where the story will come from each month. This month I want to share with you words from a scholarship application written by my daughter regarding why the jury is the cornerstone of the judicial system. Her words ring true more than 12 years later, as this was written in 2007.

In this day and age we are more divided than united at times and the division is distressing to so many. Although we may come from differing political backgrounds we are fortunate that we indeed have a balance of powers that guide our nation. The reason for this is to keep it stable and keep it going and if one decision is made by either the administrative branch, or the judicial branch or the legislative branch, the other two branches can step in and come to a decision that balances it all out.

Here are her words in bold : (She entitled the piece - "" The Fact Finders of the Truth"" .)

***We, the jury, of every courtroom in the United States of America, in order to have a more perfect union, establish justice, ensure domestic tranquility, promote the general welfare of the people, and secure the blessings of liberty for ourselves and all citizens throughout our great country, hereby proudly take our oath of duty to listen on behalf of all the people of the United States of America, to be the eyes of the common man, to carefully weigh the evidence put before us this day to discover the truth, advise the court of our findings and assist in the administration of a just verdict. (Adapted from the Preamble to the Constitution of the United States of America.)***

The jury are collectively the fact finders of the truth. They are given the task to evaluate the evidence before them and advise the court of their conclusions. Our jury system is the cornerstone of the civil justice system because it eliminates political influence in civil disputes. It also eliminates the potential problem of judges becoming legislators by judicial decisions. It is a critical step in the balance of powers under the Constitution of the United States of America.

Jury service is very important. In fact, it is essential. It is probably the single most American and patriotic duty a person can perform. It is through the civil justice system that we take our differences and fights off the street and bring them into the more civilized setting of our courtrooms. The judicial systems sorts out grievances in a way that brings justice to an unjust occurrence, and civility to chaos. Our society benefits through the confidence that the system will work. It works because the jury promotes impartiality and fairness in settling disputes.

Our juries are made up of diverse people with different cultures, values, backgrounds, knowledge, occupations, and experiences, it is a system that does not recognize outside influences. It is also a system where the voice of a person with no monetary or political influence is just as important as a person with great influence. Together, collectively, all of their experiences, knowledge and common sense form the basis of sound reasoning and logic. There is a level of confidence that it will be the sound judgment of several unbiased people and not the corruptible judgement of one. It basically eliminates non-factual related influences.

Serving on a jury is a crucially important public service. Without that, our system would fail entirely. We have a civil justice system that is virtually non-corruptible, one that the public has confidence in to interpret, enforce, and uphold the laws mandated by our forefathers in our constitution and by the legislative and administrative bodies of our government. That is largely due to impartial and unbiased juries whose decisions are based on facts and are not influenced by politics,

**power or money. It is this rock solid foundation the critical cornerstone, the civil justice system rests upon.**

When I read this again and again, I am also reminded that in this month of November is Veteran's Day, a day when we celebrate those men who have fought for our freedom to have a constitution, a judicial system that is unbiased, and all the freedoms that we enjoy with daily living that we often do not give a second thought to, much less do anything about. This month and every month, stop for a moment when you see a veteran of war or speak to one, be sure to thank him for fighting to preserve the freedom of a nation.

A few days ago, I was eating supper at The Golden Coral here in Pasadena on Spencer, when I noticed an older black gentleman at the table a few tables away who had on a military cap. He was with his son, I supposed or it sure looked like it was his son. I said to him, "Thank you for your service."

His eyes looked a little sad and hollow and he spoke very softly when he said, "It was tough there."

"I cannot imagine, all I can say is, thank you, for you protected the freedom of a nation," I replied softly.

A few minutes later as he got up to leave he came over to our table for a second and in a low and soft voice he said, "I pray every day that God forgives me. I killed many men, many men. It was tough out there." His voice was not quivering but had a tone in it that was something I hadn't heard before, a deep seated worry as he repeated the words, "many men."

I asked him if I could pray with him right then and there. The assistant manager, Mary Ann, had stopped by our table for a moment to say hello but she instinctively knew we were about to pray and she became very quiet. He replied that he would like that and I instinctively held out my hand to meet his hand and as we held hands we dropped our heads to bow and I said a prayer that went something like this, "Dear Father, we come to you to ask that you let this man know the grace of your forgiveness, that you knew and were with him as he protected his own life and the life of his buddies beside him and the lives of his family and all families as he fought to save the freedom of a nation. We thank you because of his service, we live in a country where freedom reigns and our children have known nothing but freedom. We pray that you let him feel the grace of your forgiveness every minute of every day of his life for you know the heart of this man and you know he is a good man. We pray these things in the name of our Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Amen."

When we finished he dropped back for a moment and then looked at me seriously and said slowly and softly, almost inaudibly, "I feel it! Seriously, I do feel it. I believe God has listened and I feel his forgiveness and grace. Look!" The hair on his arm was on end.

I must say I felt it, too. "What you are feeling, Sir, is the grace of God and it is real," I said fighting back tears in my eyes. He quietly left as we thanked each other. I was amazed at what happened. It was beyond words, really.

I want to thank all our Veterans, past and present, forever and ever, for serving our country and protecting the freedom of a nation. THANK YOU!


