

We are so proud of Eric being a finalist and I wanted to share in part of what I wrote to get Eric Muecke nominated for TexanPlus Champion, who has quietly done more to enrich the senior lives at Madison Jobe Senior Center than most would ever realize. Eric is a person of insight and strength who has a servant's heart to look out for people of all walks of life and station. Even last year with the devastating flooding caused by Hurricane Harvey, he helped bewildered seniors to get assistance from FEMA, Red Cross, and help from the City of Pasadena when they were frightened and afraid. Without his help, compassion, and guidance, our devastated and frustrated seniors would have had to deal with so much red tape to get the assistance that they much needed and deserved.

Eric tirelessly works to better the senior lives by creating and improving programs which entertains, excites and engages the seniors. He encourages and motivates seniors to be active which is a proven health benefit to keep seniors from feeling alienated, depressed which can lead to Alzheimer's disease, and so many senior health problems including early death. Eric introduces the guests who would like to become members of Madison Jobe Senior Center to group leaders of different programs that the center has to offer. Eric always encourages new members just to come and sit on the couches and watch TV just to get them out of their house. Eric knows once a senior arrives at the center other seniors will start talking to them and get them involved in our activities. Eric knows that the biggest step is to leave their house and be out of their comfort zone.

One of Eric's outings that he created has been to the resale and antique shops around Houston that keep the seniors active and involved. It has been an astounding success! When the seniors arrive back to Madison Jobe Senior Center they are full of energy and are so proud of all the bargains they brought. The seniors talk about all the sights they saw and items that were for sale. They always comment they cannot wait to go back to the resale shops next month. If it was up to the seniors the resale trips would happen every week!

Eric also created a partnership with San Jacinto College with their culinary and cosmetology programs. Eric has secured several times a year to take a group of seniors to San Jacinto College for a beauty day. The seniors upon their arrival are treated to a scrumptious lunch with all the food prepared by the culinary department then full salon treatment. Haircuts, manicures, pedicures and coloring with a full day of pampering and good food at all no charge to the seniors. This has been such a fantastic partnership and talk of our seniors that even the mayor of Pasadena, Jeff Wagner, heard about the event and showed up on several of their visits to greet the seniors. There was nothing but praise for Eric from me, the mayor and the seniors on this exciting program.

Eric listens to the seniors for advice on wonderful restaurants so he can plan tasty exciting lunch bunches that go outside of the senior's normal driving abilities to dining establishments. All his lunching outings are always maxed out to capacity. When this happens so many seniors will simply drive themselves to the location not because it an excellent restaurant but they know Eric will keep them laughing and make the outing a outstanding party. Seniors love a fantastic time! Eric is quick with jokes and full of interesting knowledge and facts that the seniors find to be so funny, he is a born comedian and can find humor in any situation. The seniors really hate when the lunch outing is over and Eric hates to disappoint the seniors, so, many times he will stop afterwards for ice cream or other treats that make the seniors happy. Eric knows that the seniors do not want to be treated like children and second class citizens. He makes it a point that when a senior is not themselves, he will talk to them as a compassionate friend and he listens. The seniors will hear a frank opinion from Eric that other family members and love ones will not tell them. So many seniors have told me that Eric has helped with their problem with his suggestions. Eric himself has had to deal with his own parent's struggles with senior life, including dealing with prolonged illness and death. His knowledge of the trials and tribulations of senior life is uncanny, he seems to have an inner sense of senior concerns and needs.

Madison Jobe Senior Center has also a grant program for RIDES which give funds to homebound seniors for transportation (who are either disabled or at low to median income levels who cannot drive). Without this program the seniors would not have critical transportation to everyday doctor's appointments, dialysis treatments, to get medicines, grocery shopping, or other transportation to meet their critical daily needs, which help them lead more independent lives. Eric tirelessly campaigns to get seniors on this program because he truly wants no senior be a shut-in. Eric knows that seniors will have to rely on family and friends to help them stay mobile which sometimes does not work out. Eric has in the past done errands for seniors who have been in a pinch for a need and I think that is why Eric is so endearing with the seniors because Eric can be counted on and trusted. I have also seen him take flowers to one of our seniors who may be ill at home or a funny gift just to raise another's spirits. He's even thoughtful to do the same with his fellow staff members.

Eric Muecke is the man behind many scenes of projects such as having guest speakers and instructors for upcoming meetings, crafts, programs, and classes. He researches on what is current in the senior lives and tries to develop a class on what the seniors love. Eric knows seniors tend to shy away from senior topics that involve diseases like diabetes or estate planning, so Eric plans classes with speakers on senior topics that engages and encourages seniors to ask questions and get the correct information from professionals and speakers from places like the Social Security Administration, the Better Business Bureau, and more. Eric has a natural talent and flair for decorating and each year the Madison Jobe Senior Center enters the annual Christmas Tree Circle of Trees which is exhibited at a central location at city hall. Eric has been honored to achieve several top awards over the years with themes that always delight and amaze the Madison Jobe seniors and many others when they visit the Circle of Trees. This spotlights the Madison Jobe Senior Center throughout the city which encourages more citizens to inquire about our center.

One of Madison Jobe Senior Center programs is quilting. Eric designed a class with a quilt instructor that taught different quilting techniques named block piecing. With everyone supplying a quilt block after the end of the quilt series of class it was turned into a quilt top. Eric helped construct the quilt top that was ready to be hand-quilted by the seniors in their quilting group. Eric has been seen quilting and being told how to quilt by the experienced quilting bees. Laughter can be heard mixed with music from the quilter's room. The finished quilt has tickets sold throughout the year and the quilt is raffled off at our annual Christmas Open House party with all sales of the quilt raffle going to help with purchasing coffee, computer internet and many other things the seniors enjoy.

Two of Madison Jobe's main events are the Senior Expo and Ms. Pasadena Senior Pageant. The cost of the City of Pasadena's Senior Expo far outweigh the booth rentals of this event. There are no proceeds in other words. With the rental of pipe & drape, and the staff, 30 percent of participants are for non-profit organizations that have a zero cost for entry fee. The rental of the convention center is sponsored by the city and other costs are offset by sponsors. This event would cost the city money if it were not for our generous sponsors and Eric plays a huge role in getting those sponsors, year after year and acknowledging their contributions. The city feels it is a huge public service to inform and better the lives of our senior population. This event is not for profit, it is to have senior services all under one roof in relax inviting atmosphere with booth vendor's information that will enhance our senior's lives and help families provide senior care. Madison Jobe Senior Center has an annual event called the Ms. Pasadena Senior Pageant that showcases women that redefine senior life. It is a major undertaking which includes securing major sponsors, a pageant luncheon, rehearsals, and the pageant itself. Without Eric's persistence and personality the pageant would most likely suffer and perhaps not happen at all as the event needs senior lady contestants. Eric is like the Pied Piper of Pageants and has charmed the ladies into entering the pageant who would never get out of their comfort zones by getting on stage and competing for the crown of Ms. Pasadena Senior. Eric works his magic and two years ago sweet talked fifteens ladies to enter the pageant. The limit was twelve but with the mayor's approval we had all fifteen ladies compete. Without Eric's enthusiasm and persistence, the contestants would have never entered but they would later say that they had the best time of their life in the pageant afterwards. They have bragged on Eric on how they were pampered and treated like a queen from start to finish of the pageant process and have so much fun that they often enter the next year to have the privilege of just being in the pageant and having so much fun.

Madison Jobe Senior Center has several other events a year such as Valentine Dance, Disco Party, Cinco De Mayo Party, Luau Party, Sock Hop, Fall Festival, Veterans Luncheon and our annual Christmas Open House. The reasoning I am mentioning all these events is our center is very active and these events take a lot of managing and planning that without Eric's ability to multi task our center would suffer. These monthly parties are above and beyond our monthly BINGO, day trips, quilting, crocheting, exercise class, game day, Bunco, Singing Seniors, lunch and a movie, snacks and a movie, and lunch bunch that Eric is indispensable. Another event that happens every two years is that we take the seniors to the Capitol in Austin for Senior Day at the Capitol. Eric always makes it a traveling show filled with fun and helping to connect seniors to our law makers to support senior issues.

Please consider Eric's nomination for TexanPlus Champions. He is the quiet man that is the heart, soul, reasoning, sunshine, compassion, and love for so many seniors that come to Madison Jobe Senior Center here in Pasadena, Texas. It would be a great thank you to recognize his hard work that influences so many lives for the better. He is a true patron, supporter, and creator of many wonderful programs that brighten many senior lives, change lives for the better, bring joy into people's lives who might never get such opportunities in other cities and which beautify and improve the quality of life for so many, every day through-out the year and for many years to come. The City of Pasadena Transportation **RIDES** Program



TRANSPORTATION

What is **RIDES**?

RIDES program provides non-emergency transportation services to qualified extremely low to moderate income* seniors and/or people with disabilities of any age who reside in Pasadena and who are not able to drive themselves, do not own a vehicle, or medically/physically unable to drive. **RIDES** helps them find the transportation they need for travel to essential medical services, grocery shopping, errands, social activities as well as for other needs. If eligible, a participant may receive monthly **RIDES** program funds (up to \$75 per month) that may be used with any of the designated transportation providers.

RIDES is funded in part by the City of Pasadena Community Development Block Grant and is limited to the available funds.

How do you apply?

To become a new user of **RIDES**, you must first apply and have your eligibility verified.

Applicants must submit the following with their application:

- Proof of household income
- Copy of current Social Security Award Letter
- Copy of last month's Bank Statement
- Copy of valid DL or ID card with picture
- Completed physician's disability statement (if the applicant has a disability and is under the age of 65)


