We had arrived early to kind of help her set up the paintings since we had about 25 to donate to the cause so we had plenty of time to visit back and forth as she was running around tending to the last minute details of the food, caterers and other artists who had donated their wares for the event.

"Well, if you don't mind wearing someone else's shoes, these are quite new and they go with your dress nicely and you are most welcome to wear my shoes for your presentation to the group," I said rather quietly but assuring her that I was truly sincere in my offer.

“I know it’s crazy but it would really be just wonderful but then you will be without shoes she replied wistfully. Look, I just had my cowboy boots resoled and picked them up this afternoon so they are in the car. You put these on and go give your speech while I walk to the car barefoot and go get those boots,” I said.

“You won’t care? I am a perfect stranger to you. You would trust me with your shoes?” she asked.

“Yes, I do. Anyone who is good enough to put on a fundraiser for children who need medical care can keep the shoes as far as I am concerned, so I am not bothered by that at all,” I said laughingly.

“But those boots will look rather funny with your suit, aren’t you concerned about that?” She asked.

“They might at that,” I laughed,” But honey, If someone is that concerned about my boots, I probably wouldn’t be interested in talking to them anyway and besides, we will all have a fun story to tell, afterwards,” I said.

So, I gave her my shoes and they fit her like a glove. And she walked up on stage as I was hitting the door to go get my boots, while my friends were just laughing and hooting and just thought it was the funniest thing that I had just given away a brand new pair of shoes to a perfect stranger. And yet they knew it was so me.

I got the boots on and walked back in and had the greatest time at the reception. No one much noticed the boots at all. And there was a bidding war over my painting which I just loved. It was a pretty nice blue underwater whimsical scene with starfish and Hawaiian looking flowers all in blues. One of the doctors ended up with it and it was promised to go in the children’s neurological wing as I recall. At any rate, everyone was very pleased and my painting sold for over \$600.

Now the rest of the story about three weeks later a package arrived for me at work. Now mind you, I hadn’t heard from the lady that borrowed my shoes and hadn’t even expected to ever get them back. But in this package was the kindest note, my shoes that I had loaned the lady, and a \$50 gift certificate for DSW, (Designer Shoe Warehouse).

It was a great moment in time. It was one of those days when you know there are some really good, kind, and super cool people around the planet. I had never expected to see those shoes again, and here they were and redoubled with a gift card to one of my favorite shoe stores. The note was one of those tear jerkers, too. Many times after that, my friends would often kid me about the time I gave someone the shoes off my feet rather than the shirt off my back.

The City of Pasadena Offers Options for Older Adults and People with Disabilities

The City of Pasadena Transportation **RIDES** Program



TRANSPORTATION

What is RIDES?

RIDES program provides non-emergency transportation services to qualified extremely low to moderate income* seniors and/or people with disabilities of any age who reside in Pasadena and who are not able to drive themselves, do not own a vehicle, or medically/physically unable to drive. **RIDES** helps them find the transportation they need for travel to essential medical services, grocery shopping, errands, social activities as well as for other needs. If eligible, a participant may receive monthly **RIDES** program funds (up to \$75 per month) that may be used with any of the designated transportation providers.

RIDES is funded in part by the City of Pasadena Community Development Block Grant and is limited to the available funds.

How do you apply?

To become a new user of **RIDES**, you must first apply and have your eligibility verified.

Applicants must submit the following with their application:

- Proof of household income
- Copy of current Social Security Award Letter
- Copy of last month's Bank Statement
- Copy of valid DL or ID card with picture
- Completed physician's disability statement (if the applicant has a disability and is under the age of 65)
