I have heard it said that there are about six basic things a person needs to be truly happy in this world: 1. Someone to love, 2. Something to do, 3. To feel needed/appreciated/loved, 4. To feel grateful, and 5. Something to hope for/faith and 6. Something to laugh about.

We give lip service to many of the above and talking about the importance of each and I totally agree that each area very important but a few of these stand out more than others. Hope is one that must continually be nurtured and to keep it healthy in your heart and mind for it is hope that carries us in faith as well because hope is basically the belief that life will gradually reveal what is right for your life.

Years ago I took the kids to Mount Ida in Arkansas and Crater of Diamonds State Park in Murfreesborough, Arkansas.

Crater of Diamonds is a really fun park that offers park visitors a one-of-a-kind experience—the adventure of hunting for real diamonds. The public can search about 38 acres of plowed field that is the eroded surface of the world's eighth largest diamond-bearing volcanic crater that is over 95 million years old. If you find a diamond, it is yours to keep.

Well we began our quest and search and dug all day long all over the place. WE found crystals that looked like diamonds and peridots that were a pretty green and a small garnet or two but they were almost tiny as a large grain of sand. We also go to see what the diamonds in the rough look like and they kind of have a greasy look to them and kind of shiny and are different colors ranging at that diamond mine from white to yellow to brown.

They have helpers that are there to teach you how to look for the diamonds and share stories of where some were found. They will help you identify those diamonds as you prospect. Mining tools were available to rent so we rented our fun tools and we felt like old time prospectors about to discover treasures lost to the world.

We just had a ball there and also went to close by Mount Ida where we could mine great big crystal and amethyst deposits. They kind of form in veins in the soil and they were really fun to find. The kinds found lots of these and we couldn't even carry all of our stashes down the mountain.

We learned about all kinds of quartz on that trip and brought back some fabulous finds that I still happen to be the keeper of. Not only do I have rocks in my head, I have rocks in my house as well and have had them for years.

The matrix or dirt like substance that diamonds are found in is called kimberlite and it is formed in the volcanoes. It is a green like dirt like substance like you would think you might find on the moon because it is rather greenish gray. The really cool thing about Crater of Diamonds Park is that they would sell you bags of the unprocessed kimberlite all “cutesied” up for gifts or you could pack some in your own duffel bags to take with you for free. Well of course when it got dark and time to leave, we filled our one smallish duffel bag to the top with kimberlite and we could hardly carry it to the car.

What we did not realize is that we were really creating a big bag of hope. Every time money would get tight, we would threaten to process our bag of hope and maybe find the world’s largest diamond. Then it got to the point that very few things were worthy of even thinking of processing that bag because we were almost afraid that nothing would be there and we would have nothing to fall back on and lose our hope. Then we got to the point of agreeing that every one of the family members would need to be present when we did wash all the kimberlite but as everyone went to college, it got harder and harder to get everyone there at the same time and when we did, we were having so much fun that we would forget to do it. I have dragged that bag around now to everywhere I have moved for more than 25 years, still intact and unopened.

It is so funny that one small duffel bag of basically dirt, well OK, kimberlite, held so much hope for so many years. Hope is such an important thing to have and an even greater gift to give to others. Hope gets you through tough times and it gives you the belief that everything will somehow turn out OK.

I’m sure that if you think about it, you all have many bags of hope you never even thought about but in different forms. Maybe it is a special shirt, a special card that someone sent, a saying that you come across that makes you remember what hope feels like. Hope restores belief, restores the soul, restores faith and makes life a happy place where anything good can happen at any moment.

So, I challenge you to gather up all your bags of hope and think about the things that make you happy and hopeful and look at them every day to feel the joy of daily living. Hope is a rose blooming, a tomato plant producing a tomato to eat, a pretty photo or picture. Hope is everywhere. Find it and share it. It will make life happier. And I will bring my sack of hope up here for you all to see if you ask. It’s just an old blue dusty duffel bag but it is filled with love, good times, and with lots of hope.

The City of Pasadena Offers Options for Older Adults and People with Disabilities

The City of Pasadena Transportation **RIDES** Program



TRANSPORTATION

What is RIDES?

RIDES program provides non-emergency transportation services to qualified extremely low to moderate income* seniors and/or people with disabilities of any age who reside in Pasadena and who are not able to drive themselves, do not own a vehicle, or medically/physically unable to drive. **RIDES** helps them find the transportation they need for travel to essential medical services, grocery shopping, errands, social activities as well as for other needs. If eligible, a participant may receive monthly **RIDES** program funds (up to \$75 per month) that may be used with any of the designated transportation providers.

RIDES is funded in part by the City of Pasadena Community Development Block Grant and is limited to the available funds.

How do you apply?

To become a new user of **RIDES**, you must first apply and have your eligibility verified.

Applicants must submit the following with their application:

- Proof of household income
- Copy of current Social Security Award Letter
- Copy of last month's Bank Statement
- Copy of valid DL or ID card with picture
- Completed physician's disability statement (if the applicant has a disability and is under the age of 65)


